As a Coordinator and Interpreter for World Vision International, Germain Dominique Ndiaye made a recent visit to Columbia, SC while accompanying 10 year old Mamadou Lamine Ndiaye, the victim of an aggressive tumor, to the United States. Both from Senegal, Lamine and Germain came to the U.S. to receive medical care for Lamine's life threatening condition. They were bound for Palmetto Health Children's Hospital where Lamine was to receive surgery, free of charge, thanks to the hospital waiving their fees for the procedure.

Through the generosity of many members of the Columbia community, Lamine's surgery was successful and the tumor was removed. Now tumor free, he can return to normal activities such as attending school.

When Dennis Corporation's staff read Lamine's story in *The State* paper, Tim Antley, Construction Services Manager, contacted his friend, Mark Waller. Mr. Waller has been helping the young boy by opening his home for him and Germain to stay until they returned to Senegal.

After a brief conversation with Mr. Waller, Mr. Antley discovered that Germain had hoped to purchase a laptop computer while in the United States but had been unable to do so. Dennis Corporation was able to donate one of their laptop computers to Germain the night before he left to return to Senegal.
